Introduction

As my third and final year on the CNC Governing



Board comes to an end, I once again have the pleasure of providing you a glimpse at the last year's worth of business matters of the Church. However, since I could not possibly do it alone, I would like to once again introduce our board. Our members this year included Rob Kearney (Member), Joe Lockhart (Member), Gillian Rouge (Treasurer), Shula Gossard (Correspondence), Scotti Fritts (Secretary), and Lina Washabaugh (Chairman). It is the service and honor of the CNC Governing Board to oversee the business and financial matters of the church as we look to God for his guidance and provision. He is Our Great Provider. Each year I have served on our board has been a year of financial struggle for CNC, and 2023 continued to be so. However, I have learned over these 3 years of service as your board member, that when we come to the end of our own means, we really get to see the amazing love and provision of our Holy Father, as he cares for his body, the Church. We came into this year with a budget that had many necessary cuts, including our donut fund, paying a dedicated groundskeeper, and reductions to the salaries of both our Lead and Associate Pastor. Despite trying to adopt a budget that was within our means, monthly giving has remained low, and many months were below what we needed to make ends meet. By August the cushion we had set aside to cover short months was almost gone, and then a miracle happened.

God is Good

A company informed us that they had accidentally been overcharging us for years and gave us a substantial refund. God had provided what we needed. As giving continued to be tight, the board looked into other means to help provide the Church with income. Despite the concentrated effort by many, most ideas did not pan out, and then God provided again with the hope of a sale of our property to the Rancho Cordova Food Locker. As we continue to pursue this business transaction we have high hopes of being able to use the land for the service of the community, as was its original intention, of partnering with another organization that can help us minister to our neighbors, and of relieving the heavy burden of debt that our mortgage has been for our congregation. As we looked towards 2024 and adopted another budget of even more cuts to salaries and other areas, things again looked grim, but then God provided twice more. First, we were given an anonymous gift that allowed us to fix broken appliances, and bless our youth with the ability to do missions once again. Then we were given a large gift from an estate that allowed us to fully restore the salaries of all of our Pastoral Staff to 2022 levels before we had to make any cuts. When we were down, the Lord provided hope, and means over and over again. I encourage you all to trust the Lord when you think you are at the end of your ability, financial or otherwise, and see the amazing works he can do for you, and through you.

Fun & Fellowship

- 25 women attended the friendship themed Mug & Muffin. Sonja Flood talked about how friendships helps us. Then Pastor Susan shared about how to make friends. The biggest plus was there was lots of talking/connection at the tables in part due to Shirley Skadan-Smith's questions.
- On a hot Saturday in July, Dawn King had the women over for a Potluck Pool Party. It was well attended. Three of the women had not been to an event before.
- 11 women (and 1 man) attended the Card Making and Lunch. The \$10 lunch was organized/ prepared by Jamie Skrabec and Susan Wait-Thompson. Gillian Rouge is our resident expert in card making and teaching.
- Eight women did a Sunday morning book study on friendship: Find Your People by Jennie Allen. We didn't love the book, but we loved the connections we made with each other. Three ladies joined us who had not been a part of a study before. The group went on to do an advent series. The goal of finding our people was accomplished.
- The Sock Exchange Christmas Party was a blast with a photo booth, themed tables (dreamed up/provided by Susan Wait-Thompson and Jamie Skrabec), a Left-Right game led by Shirley Skadan-Smith, and a sock devotional (Pastor Susan). I am sure I heard all 32 women exclaim "What a great time."
